On this day... June 7th, 1981

Tom Watson (inset), one of the most popular players on the tour, found himself in an unusual position in his quest for a 28th career PGA Tour win in the final round of the Atlanta Classic at Atlanta Country Club where the vast majority of the galleries threw their favour behind local player Tommy Valentine in his bid for a breakthrough win on the circuit.



Watson had started the day a stroke behind co-leaders Valentine and Lee Elder but shot a closing 71 for a total of 11-under-par 277. Watson scrambled to save bogey on the 18th hole and then watched as Valentine sank a four-footer

for birdie to join him on that score and force a playoff.

In the sudden death, both players parred the par three 16th - Watson chipping out of heavy greenside rough for a tap-in par save - and then the two halved the 17th with birdies.

On the 18th, Valentine's third shot to the par five finished in a greenside bunker and he splashed out to 15 feet but was unable to hole the putt. Watson, on in three, two-putted from 15 feet for a winning par which earned him a payday of \$54,000 and, with his third win of the year, moved him to the top of the PGA Tour's moneylist.

Know the rules



QIn a singles match (matchplay), Player A concedes Player B's short putt for a four. Player B then attempts to hole out and misses the short putt at which point Player A claims the hole. What is the ruling?

A Rule 6.5 covers such a situation and the concession in this case stands and Player B has completed the hole in four strokes. As per the rule, a player has completed the hole in matchplay when the player holes out or the player's next stroke is conceded; the result of the hole is decided (such as when the opponent concedes the hole, the opponent's score for the hole is lower than the player possibly could make or the player or opponent gets the general penalty (loss of hole).

Notice of Direct Planning Application to An Bord Pleanála
in Respect of a Strategic Infrastructure Development
County Roscommon

In accordance with Section 37E of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) Energia Renewables ROI Ltd gives notice of its intention to make an application for planning permission to An Bord Pleanála for a ten-year planning permission for the following development in the townlands of Turrock, Cronin, Gortaphull, Glenrevagh, Tullyneeny, Bredagh, Cuilleenirwan, Cuilleenoolagh, Curry, Milltown, Tobermaclooughlin, Skeavally, Boleyduff, Cloonacally, Feacle, Cam, Tawnagh, Corragheha, Pollalaher, Brideswell, Knockanool, Ballymillavill, Rooskagh, Belanamulla, Cloonakille, Monkstand and Commeen, Co. Roscommon.

The development will consist of the following:

- I. 20 no. wind turbines with an overall ground to blade tip height of 180 metres, a rotor diameter of 162m and a hub height of 99m, associated foundations, hard-standing areas
- II. 15 no. spoil storage areas at hardstands of turbines no. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 (in the townlands of Turrock, Gortaphull, Cronin, and Tullyneeny) and turbines no. 8, 10, 11, 13, 14, 17, 19 and 20 (in the townlands of Milltown, Cuilleenoolagh, Cloonacally, Feacle and Tawnagh)
- III. Provision of 1 no. permanent meteorological mast with a maximum height of 100 metres for a period of 30 years from the date of commissioning of the entire wind farm
- IV. Provision of 1 no. 110kV onsite substation in the townland of Cam, along with associated control buildings, MV switchgear building, associated electrical plant, associated security fencing, and equipment and wastewater holding tank
- V. All underground electrical and communication cabling connecting the proposed wind turbines to the proposed onsite substation and associated control buildings and plant
- VI. All works associated with the connection of the proposed wind farm to the national electricity grid via underground 110kV cabling from the site to the existing Auhone 110kV substation located in the townland of Monkstand. Cabling will be placed within the public road corridor of the R362, R363 and L2047, or on private land
- VII. Upgrade works to the existing 110kV Auhone substation consisting of the construction of an additional dedicated bay to facilitate connection of the cable
- VIII. Provision of 2 no. new site access north and south from the R363 and upgrade of 1 no. junction south of the R363
- IX. Provision of new access tracks/roads and upgrade of existing access tracks/roads
- X. 7 no. overburden storage areas
- XI. 2 no. temporary construction compounds
- XII. Site drainage works
- XIII. Operational stage site signage
- XIV. All associated site development works, apparatus and signage

The application is seeking a ten-year planning permission and 30-year turbine operational period from the date of commissioning of the entire wind farm.

An Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) and Natura Impact Statement (NIS) have been prepared in respect of the proposed development and accompanies this planning application.

The planning application, Environmental Impact Assessment Report and Natura Impact Statement may be inspected free of charge or purchased on payment of a specified fee (which shall not exceed the reasonable cost of making such a copy) during public opening hours for a period of seven weeks commencing on the 13th June 2022 at the following locations:

- i. The implications of the proposed development for proper planning and sustainable development, and
- ii. The likely effects on the environment of the proposed development, and
- iii. The likely effects of the proposed development on a European site, if carried out.

Any submissions/observations must be accompanied by a fee of €50 (except for certain prescribed bodies) and must be received by the Board not later than 5.30 p.m. on the 1st August 2022. Such submissions/observations must also include the following information:

- The name of the person making the submission or observation, the name of the person acting on his or her behalf, if any, and the address to which any correspondence relating to the application should be sent.
- The subject matter of the submission or observation, and
- The reasons, consideration and arguments on which the submission or observation is based in full (Article 217 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001, as amended, refers)

Any submissions or observations which do not comply with the above requirements cannot be considered by the Board.

The Board may at its absolute discretion hold an oral hearing on the application (refer to 'A Guide to Public Participation in Strategic Infrastructure Development' at www.pleanala.ie). The Board may in respect of an application for permission decide to:

- (a) (i) grant the permission, or
- (ii) make such modifications to the proposed development as so modified, or
- (iii) grant permission in respect of part of the proposed development (with or without specified modifications of the foregoing kind), and any of the above decisions may be subject to or without conditions, or
- (b) Refuse permission to grant the permission
